

New Mexico Rapids Presents
2026 Gaylord Sheppard Tournament - November 2026
Pueblo of Santa Ana Sports Complex

Gaylord Shepard is open to all currently registered USYSA, Club Soccer, ODP, AYSO, and SAY boys and girl's teams. Guest players may be added, but must follow the guest player procedures outlined in the roster verification process. The following maximum roster sizes will be allowed: At U13 - 19, 22 players may be registered on the team but ONLY 18 players may be rostered to play in each game. The corresponding maximum roster figures (in parenthesis) are as follows for these age groups: U11 & U12 - 9v9 (16), and U9 - 10 7v7 (12).

The maximum roster size INCLUDES any and all guest players. No player may play for more than one team per weekend. A team roster along with pass cards for each player and coach must also be presented to the referee prior to each game (roster will not be returned). The age of all players shall be determined according to the Rule 204 of US Youth Soccer's Policy on Players and Player Rules.

REGISTRATION

State required items:

- Official association team rosters
- Player cards/coach cards
- Medical release forms
- Guest player forms
- Permission to travel forms from respective state association if team is from outside of Region 4.

ROSTER VERIFICATION PROCESS - THERE WILL BE NO ONSITE/GAME DAY CHECK-INS

ALL COACHES & STAFF MUST HAVE THEIR EMAIL LISTED IN GOTSPORT REGISTRATION ROSTER SYSTEM FOR CONFLICT SCHEDULING & TOURNAMENT UPDATES

No team will be accepted in the 2026 Gaylord Sheppard until its Entry Fee payment in full has been received and processed successfully, and an official Roster and Passcards have been uploaded, reviewed and accepted by the Tournament Director or their staff. If your Roster has pictures you do not need to upload passcards

All entering teams will be assigned an "APPLIED" status until their Entry Fee payment has been received and processed successfully (and rosters/cards uploaded). Then their status will be changed to "ACCEPTED".

All payments are absolutely FINAL and there will be NO REFUNDS issued for any partial cancellations/suspension of matches, weather-related delays and/or shortening of matches, opponents failing to show up, etc. If the ENTIRE tournament weekend is cancelled, there will be a prorated REFUND issued to teams within (30) days after the Event Dates."

Documentation Approval Process:

1. Upload Roster and Passcards when applying. If Roster has pictures you do not need to upload passcards. When uploading passcards please take 1-2 pictures and upload pictures. Cross out players not playing
2. Print a Copy of the roster to turn in to referee for every game

GUEST PLAYERS

- To add a guest player please handwrite (legibly) the following information for each guest player at the bottom of your official roster and upload into gosport. The guest passcard also needs to be uploaded in the gosport system
 - Full Name
 - Unique Jersey Numbers
 - Date of Birth

DOCUMENTS NEEDED AT EACH GAME

- Team rosters to turn into referee (Coach will provide 1 copy each game and it will be kept by the Referee)

PRE-GAME REFEREE CHECK IN

- Coach shall provide a team roster for each game that the referee keeps
- Referee(s) shall, prior to the start of the game verify the identity of each player and coach with their Roster
- The Referee must not allow a player into the game who is not on the roster from the team that is playing.

LAWS OF THE GAME

FIFA Laws shall apply with the following exceptions:

- DCSL Metro Rules of Play 2026-2027 and the modified rules for the U9-U11 small-sided games. Both can be found in the current Duke City Soccer League Metro Coaches Handbook located at www.dukecity.org
- Unlimited substitutions. Substitutions shall be from the midfield line with the consent of the referee at any stoppage of play. For U17 and above games in brackets that include a team from outside the US, a maximum of six substitutions (per team) will be allowed.

GAME SCHEDULES

Each team will be scheduled to play a minimum of three games if weather and circumstance allow. The type of schedule depends on the number of teams in the age group bracket.

GAME TIME AND TIES

U15-U16	35 Min Halves	Size 5
U-17-U19	35 Min Halves	Size 5

Ties will stand in all games except in Semi Final and Championship games. If a tie exists at the end of a Semi Final or Championship game, the winner will be determined by kicks from the mark (KFTM) in accordance with FIFA Laws of the Game.

DISCIPLINE FOR MISCONDUCT

Any coach or player sent off the field by the referee (red card) for misconduct will serve a minimum of one additional game suspension. In cases involving fighting and other serious conduct, this suspension may be increased. We acknowledge that playing games on Santa Ana Pueblo land is a privilege, not a right and that Santa Ana Pueblo may impose additional disciplinary actions." The offending coach or player may be required to leave the field for the remainder of the game and move to a distance where they cannot be heard by anyone involved with playing or coaching the game and refrain from communicating with either team. No substitution shall be allowed for an ejected player. ONE (1) point shall be deducted from the team's point total for EACH red card

issued. The pass card shall be held by the referee and turned over to a tournament official. The pass card may be retrieved after the completion of the next game, when the player or coach is eligible to return to the field. Red cards will be reported to the home state associations. Upon written request, the tournament will honor all suspensions and disciplinary actions taken by the team's home league and will communicate appropriate league and state authorities information or discipline administered during the tournament. Matters involving referee assault or abuse will be referred immediately to the host state association. Coaches are responsible for the conduct of their players and spectators at all times during the tournament. POLICY 531-9 – MISCONDUCT TOWARD GAME OFFICIALS IN AMATEUR MATCHES

Section 1 | General

Misconduct against Referees may occur before, during, and/or after the match, specifically when the referee arrives at and/or departs the venue.

Section 3 | Terms and Reference

2) "Hearing" means a meeting of at least three neutral members, one of whom is designated or elected to serve a chairperson.

Section 4 | Jurisdiction and Hearings - B – Events and Tournaments

- 1) In the event of assault, abuse, or gross mistreatment of a Referee occurs the referee shall (B) forward a copy of the game report and his/her comments on the incident to the Event/Tournament Chairmen.
- 2) The Event/Tournament Chairperson shall have the right to immediately convene a hearing at the site of the Event/Tournament, at which the alleged offender, the coach of the alleged offender when the offender is a player, and the game official should be present.

Section 5 | Penalties and Suspensions

Penalties for violation of this policy shall be assigned according to the Penalties Matrix in effect at the time the misconduct allegedly occurred.

POINTS SCORING

Points shall be awarded thusly: Three (3) points for a win, One (1) point for a tie, and Zero (0) points for a loss. In the event of a forfeit, Three (3) points will be awarded for the forfeit win and Zero (0) to the forfeiting team. In the event of a tie in total points, placement for out of bracket play will be determined in this order: (1) winner of head to head competition, (2) greatest total goal difference—up to 4 per game, (3) most total goals for (limit 4 per game), (4) least total goals allowed (limit 4 per game), (5) FIFA penalty kicks if possible, and (6) a coin toss. The game report including scores, cautions and ejections will be filled out and signed by the referee and handed to the referee coordinator at the site where the games are played. The scorekeeper at the site will compile and report the results on the GotSport website and will keep a copy in the scorebook located at the tournament headquarters.

FORFEITS

If a team is unable to field (7) players (for teams playing 11v11), (6) players (for teams playing 9v9), (5) players (for teams playing 7v7), (15) minutes after the scheduled game time, that team will forfeit that game. Since the purpose of the tournament is to play the games and the tournament hosts a number of out of state teams unfamiliar with the venues or because there may have been last minute changes that were not properly communicated, the Tournament Director will consider the reasons for the team's tardiness before declaring a forfeit or allowing additional time before

declaring a forfeit. If a team forfeits a game without justifiable cause, it will be disqualified from semi-final and Championship games.

CONDUCT

No animals, alcoholic beverages, verbal abuse, or physical abuse will be allowed on any of the fields or in the parking lots. No smoking will be allowed near the fields. No coach, spectator or bench personnel are to enter the field of play during a game, PARTICULARLY if an incident occurs on the field. Coaches and substitutes may enter the field only when indicated to do so by the referee. Only the team captains or coaches of the team may address the referee before, during, or after a game, and then only for the purpose of information, not to question decisions. This applies from the time the referee arrives at the venue until he/she leaves, not just during the game. Under NO circumstances should anyone ever touch a referee. Instead of addressing the referee, attendees are to write down their concerns and upload them to the QR code present on the feedback card provided in person and on the DCSL website. Participants are to be properly chaperoned at all times, including while at the hotels. Under NO circumstances will destructive, threatening or out of control behavior be tolerated. Violation of these guidelines can result in barring the offending person(s) from the fields, suspension or cancellation of games, or ejection of person(s) &/or entire teams from the tournament. All serious infractions will be reported to the state associations. The team representative will be required to provide a signed conduct form indicating that all the participants and spectators have been informed of these conduct guidelines.

GAME BALLS

The game ball shall be provided by the home team, if they do not have a ball that is acceptable to the referee the visiting team may provide the ball. The visiting team may request that the ball be a white or white and black color.

PLAYER EQUIPMENT

Home team is designated as the first team listed on the schedule. For games with no teams listed (e.g. Championship), the team with the name in the schedule first alphabetically will be the home team. Both teams must bring two sets of uniforms to each game. The home team is required to wear the light uniform (including socks) and the away team is required to wear the dark uniform (including socks). If, in the opinion of the Referee, there is a color conflict, the team causing the conflict must change.

A player's uniform shall consist of a shirt, shorts, socks, shin guards, and appropriate footwear. Teams must wear uniquely numbered shirts, with the number on each player's shirt corresponding to his/her number on the roster. Goalkeepers shall wear colors that distinguish them from other players. Hard casts with adequate padding will be permitted at the discretion of the match referee, soft casts are permitted with the approval of the match referee.

SUSPENSION OF PLAY

If play is suspended or cancelled (for inclement weather, field conditions or other situations beyond the tournament's control), after the completion of the first half, that game shall be considered complete and official. If a game is suspended prior to completing the first half, the tournament committee shall decide how to complete the game (a shorter game or a PK shootout). The Tournament Director or Tournament staff may also decide to not complete the game if circumstances beyond control arise. There will be absolutely NO REFUNDS issued for delayed, suspended, or cancelled games.

PROTESTS

NO protests will be allowed. Decisions by referees MAY NOT be appealed. Eligibility issues and the interpretation of these rules shall be the responsibility of the Tournament Director and those decisions are final and MAY NOT be appealed.
